Guidelines

- Blogs are typically between 800-1100 words, but shorter contributions are also welcomed.

 - Infrastructure
 - Critical Theory and Decoloniality

- Blogs should aim to include at least one good quality image accompanied with a caption.
- Blogs should be accessible and understandable to a wide audience, e.g. use everyday language and explain any more complex concepts with which not everyone will be familiar.
- We welcome contributions in any of our GRRIPP languages (EN, ES, PT, FR), even better if translations can be provided as well.
- Include a short author bio (and a picture of yourself, if you would like) so your readers can know a little more about you, e.g.:
